

Pupil Premium 2013 – 2014

The level of pupil premium was £953 per pupil known to be eligible. The school allocation was £148,668.

The majority of pupils made at least expected progress in reading, writing and maths.

At the end of key stage 1 the gap between PP and other pupils nationally is closing at level 2 and above. In school the gap between PP and non PP pupils has increased due to the rise in all pupils' attainment year on year. This gap will be a focus in 2014/15.

At the end of key stage 2 89% of pupils made at least expected progress from KS1 in English and 95% in mathematics. 63%, 42% and 32% made above expected progress in reading, writing and maths - above the 34% made by other pupils nationally in reading and writing. The gap between PP and other pupils nationally is closing year on year at level 4 and above. The gap at level 5 and above will be a focus in 2014/15.
