Communication and Language Development:

We will maintain attention, concentrate and sit quietly during an appropriate activity- during circle times and small group activities.

We will follow a story without pictures or props. We will question why things happen and give explanations-talking about different animals and their young.

We will extend our vocabulary, exploring the meaning of new words- discussing different animals and their young, also what happens on a farm.

Understanding the World:

We will talk about significant events and experiences-talking about what the children did over the half term.

We will comment and ask questions about the natural world-learning about farm animals and their young.

We will visit a Farm to find out more about the animals that live there.

We will use iPads to create a video diary of the duckling eggs.

We will complete a simple programme on the computer to create pictures, follow instructions and to practise sounds and counting.

Mathematical Development:

Begins to use 'teens' to count beyond 10.

Records, using marks that they can interpret and explain.

Finds the total number of items in two groups by counting them all.

In practical activities and discussion, beginning to use the vocabulary involved in adding or subtracting. Begins to identify own mathematical problems based on own interests and fascinations.

Personal Social and Emotional Development:

We will play in a group, extending and elaborating ideas-learning to talk to each other and share ideas

We will take steps to resolve conflict with others e.g. Taking turns to hold the ducklings.

We will play co-operatively, taking turns with others.

We will show sensitivity to the needs of others.
