Horton Grange Primary School KS2 SATs results 2016

This year the SATs taken by Year 6 were different to those set in previous years and reflected the new national curriculum which the children had just started to follow. This is significantly more challenging than the previous curriculum. You may have seen in the press that the outcomes nationally are much lower than in previous years because the tests are much harder. Only half (53%) of the children in the country reached the 'expected standard' in reading, writing and maths combined. This does not mean that the children have done less well this year or that standards in the country have fallen – simply that expectations have been significantly increased and that what the government had deemed to be acceptable in previous years is not seen as acceptable this year. At Horton Grange we were in line with the national figures for this standard with 52% pupils achieving the combined measure. Despite this additional level of challenge, children at Horton have continued to perform well in terms of progress compared to national data, which we are delighted about. We also perform above national in Writing, Spelling, punctuation and grammar outcomes and are broadly in line for reading and maths outcomes.
